The Impact of Affordable Housing on Savannah

At our October 15 meeting Dr. Kenneth Zapp presented the topic of Affordable Housing from the factual perspective of an economist. What many would think of as a "dry subject", Dr. Zapp showed us just how significant an impact this issue has on the local economy.

Cases in point:

- 1. There are over 100,000 households in Chatham county that spend more than 30% of their income on housing, leaving little remaining for other necessities.
- 2. At the minimum wage of \$7.50/hour, a worker would need to work 92 hours per week to afford a typical one bedroom apartment, without it being a significant cost burden.

Dr. Zapp finished his presentation outlining what other municipalities are doing to address the dwindling number of affordable housing units in their jurisdictions.

The local issue in Savannah / Chatham County is that this problem is not at all recognized and only private organizations are trying to address it. The direction is for it to get worse before it gets better.
