Chairman Chester Ellis and Commissioner Patrick Farrell Chatham County Board of Commissioners

Addressed major issues impacting Chatham County including Skidaway Island. Answered pointed questions from our members.

Patti Lyons

President/CEO of Senior Citizens, Inc.

Ms. Lyons has a unique perspective on the issue of aging, having been the President of the Senior Citizens, Inc (SCI) for twenty-five years. She believes the key is providing a continuum of care while allowing people to live at home. SCI has been doing just that for years. Importantly, as a private, local non-profit organization, SCI has been able to pursue

Justice Unites Savannah Together (JUST) Rabbi Robert Haas, Congregation Mickve Israel, Savannah

Many congregants at churches, synagogues, and mosques do volunteer work in their communities through soup kitchens, housing efforts, and other community-based social action organizations. But never in his long experience in Houston and other places had congregants become involved in social justice initiatives, i.e. in efforts to make long-term positive changes for those in need through legislation and government policy changes. This is because a single congregation, even a very large one, does not have the power by itself to effectively advocate for such changes. JUST has several dozen leaders of local houses of worship from across the religious spectrum working together for positive change in our community.

The Opioid Crisis and Fentanyl Michael Sarhatt Director of the Chatham Savannah Counter Narcotics Team

Opioids slow the respiratory system down. Fentanyl can shut it down and kill instantly. In 2021, there were over 100,000 opioid overdose deaths. It is the #1 cause of death for people between 19 and 45. The fentanyl epidemic is far more deadly than previous drug epidemics because with fentanyl there may be no time for recovery. They CNT is no longer seeing heroin on the street. Fentanyl is being sold cut with fillers like beef tenderizer.

The nasal spray Narcan can be used to reverse an opioid overdose. It blocks the effects of the opioid on the brain and can restore breathing. All emergency medical professionals carry Narcan. The CNT is training 350 officers on the use of Narcan.
